Trinity Tidings

Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

Starting a letter with "I hope this finds you well" seems to carry some extra weight as of late, as we are collectively responding to COVID, and the upheaval it has caused in our lives. The extra worry, taking extra precautions, and dealing with cancelled or modified events and activities has been taxing on our lives, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. And so, truly, I hope this letter finds you well.

I hope you and your loved ones are healthy, and that you have a sense of peace that can only come from God. But for many of you, just like with all the other activities and events in life, church has been disrupted as well. Last March, the end of Confirmation was rather abrupt, as well as Sunday School and other Bible Studies. Worship transitioned to online only, and the comment I heard over and over (besides people being appreciative that we were still able to worship) was "It just wasn't the same," because it wasn't.

But there comes a point when we, as a church and as God's people who are dealing with all changes with COVID, need to move from being "reactive" to being "proactive." And, with the information that kids are less affected by COVID, we felt it was time to start doing some proactive planning, especially when it comes to helping to minister to our young people.

Because, especially for our youth, who have experienced a disruption in schooling, and friendships, and all the things a childhood is supposed to have (like hugs, smiles, shared activities, and achieving accomplishments), our youth have had to adapt to "life with COVID" (including social distancing, wearing masks, cancelled events, and virtual life). And though it's just been a little more than 4 months, the impact has been especially difficult for young people.

Take, for example, the average 10-year-old. They have been alive for 120 months. Now, COVID has been affecting their lives for 4 months. If you do the math, that is 3.33% of their life, which doesn't seem like much. But to have the same impact on a 70-year-old, it would be equivalent (in ratio to the rest of their life) as 2.33 years. The same 3.33% of a 70-year-old's life is equal to 28 months. So, to miss church, or school or Sunday school as a kid for months on end, is like missing it for years to a senior citizen.

So, knowing that, we had to react. And, coupled with knowing it is less dangerous for younger people, **we have some exciting programming being planned**. On Aug. 14th, we are hosting an outdoor movie, showing "Sonic the Hedgehog." This will include serving Carbone's Pizza, prepackaged snacks and refreshments, live music, and even the ability to watch the movie in your car (if it rains) over an AM transmitter.
