Well, it's officially been a year now. If you remember back to March of 2020, you might recall that your lives may have drastically changed that month. In fact, this month, March 2021 marks the one-year anniversary of our collective efforts to flatten the curve in response to the novel coronavirus.

On, March 13, 2020, Governor Tim Walz declared a state of emergency for the State of Minnesota. On March 15, he then announced the temporary closure of all Minnesota K-12 public schools from March 18 until March 27. And then on March 16, he ordered all non-essential businesses close until March 27, 2020. On March 14, South Shore Trinity broadcast our first live-stream worship service, and on March 21, we all began worshipping online. For some, that was temporary until we opened back up in June. For others, you've only worshipped online since.

The rest of the year consisted of bracing for impact as we experienced wave after wave of COVID numbers going up and down. Some of you got COVID. Some of you know someone who got COVID. It seems we all know someone who has died of COVID. Sadly, not all who encountered this disease had made it through, and have succumbed to this new way to die.

Here we are a year later, and it feels as though almost every aspect of life has changed. It makes one wonder if we'll ever go back to "normal." Will we ever hug each other without that moment of hesitation first? Will handshakes come back as the standard greeting? Will lipstick companies ever bounce back, or will masks be required from now on?

And, for many, the only hope they have, that we will get back to normal, is by taking the vaccine. And not just them, but the only hope they have for the world is if *every*one takes the vaccine. The only hope they have is if everyone practices social distancing perfectly. The only hope is if we all quarantine to stop the spread. If only...

As Christians, let's consider how God, in His Word, encourages to respond. And where it is that we are to find our hope. We are encouraged put our faith—not in the actions of man—but in God, and trust in His plan. Hebrews 11:1 says, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." The place we Christians find our hope isn't in the eradication or containment of disease, but it's found in the one true God, who loves us and sent the Savior for us, and who give us life everlasting.

The wound inflicted upon society by this past year of COVID will be a scar that will likely stay with us for years to come. The loved ones lost, either to the disease or from self-harm and or substance abuse due to the mental anguish that came from the way we reacted to COVID, will weigh on our hearts. The fear of neighbor, and mistrust of governmental leaders on both sides of the aisle, will have ramifications that may last decades.

But to God be the glory as he continues to walk along side each and every one of us, as we face the reality of living in this sin-filled and broken world. In HIM do we find our hope. In the actions of God, in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, do we find our hope. Matthew 24:35 reminds us, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." That word of promise, that word of love, that word of comfort, that word of salvation will be what sustains us now, and forever. Amen.
