

As We Gather - Raising Our Children on Purpose

At the end of Matthew 28, as Jesus is getting ready to ascend into heaven, he gives his disciples the "Great Commission" saying, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." And though that can seem a daunting task to disciple "all nations," there are specific individuals that God gives to parents to disciple: Your children. By raising your children, you are discipling our children. The phrase "It takes a village to raise a child" is a proverb that means that an entire community of people must provide for and interact positively with children for those children to experience and grow in a safe and healthy environment. For us in the church, that means every member of the congregation has a stake in raising the children of the congregation. The Sermon Series "Joining Jesus as a Family" (based on the book written by Greg and Susan Finke) will help the parents and congregation learn what this can look like as we set out on the goal of raising our children on purpose, discipling them to be fellow followers of Christ.






