

As We Gather – "How to Train Our Children to Use Their Superpower"

In Week One of our sermon series, we looked at how Jesus gives parents children to disciple – to become Jesus followers and how others can walk alongside parents. In Week Two, we looked at how parents (and others) can disciple and empower their children to live out their faith in Jesus. Today, in Week Three, we will unpack how we can use God's love, as our superpower, to grow in our ability to help others by practicing five mission skills. They are: 1) Seeking the Kingdom, 2) Hearing from Jesus in the Gospels, 3) Talking with People, 4) Doing Good, and 5) Ministering through Prayer.
